Program Age Levels: All levels of Girl Scouts

Purpose: To learn about and promote the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund

Patch Requirements: All levels must complete #1 and #2 plus

Daisy and Brownie: 1 more activity

Junior: 3 more activities

Cadette and Above: 4 more activities

1. Daisy, Brownie and Junior Girl Scouts: Participate in a Service Unit event such as an International Event, a Thinking Day Ceremony, a Girl Scout Birthday Event, or Juliette Low Event.

Teen Girl Scouts: Plan and carry out a Service Unit event mentioned above.

2. Learn about the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund and how it is used to help girls. Donate to the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund. Make your contribution in a novel manner. For example: 10 cents for every year of a Girl Scouts. age.

3. Learn the meaning of the World Trefoil Pin.

4. Learn about the four World Centers, their names, where they are and what happens there. Play a game or sing a song from a WAGGGS country.

5. Compare badges written in the book *How Girls Can Help Their Country*** by Juliette Low in 1912 **or** another badge book that is no longer used with badges today. Are requirements the same or different? Complete one of the requirements of a badge from the book.

6. Find out how Girl Scouting began. Discover things like:
- where the idea came from
 - how and when Girl Scouting began in the United States
 - what were the first groups like
 - what form of government did they use
 - what recognitions could be earned

7. Learn about Juliette Low's life. Find out the kind of life she lead; what the high points were in her life; where was she born; what has happened to her birthplace now.
