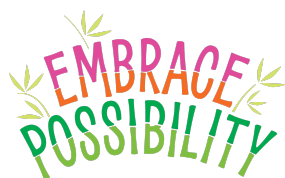

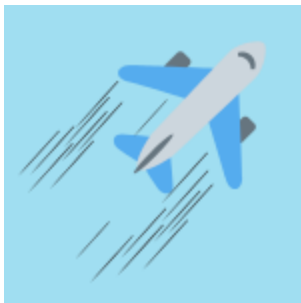

Troop Travel



If your troop is planning an outing that involves an overnight, an [Intent to Travel](#) form must be submitted. Please send this paperwork to Customer Care **4 weeks** prior to your domestic travel activity. If you do not meet this requirement, your travel plans may not be approved, as stated on the form.

If your trip is an international destination, you **must** submit your intent to travel **3 months** prior to your trip.

We ask this to allow enough time for data verification and approval. This process ensures the safety of our girls and volunteers.

The purchase of additional insurance is required for all domestic travel outside of the state of Idaho (3P0 and all international trips (3PI).

If more than one troop is participating in the adventure, an Intent to Travel packet is required from each troop.

First Aid & CPR Classes



Brownie & Junior First Aid Program

This hands-on program teaches essential safety skills while Girl Scouts earn their First Aid Badge. Through fun activities and real-world practice, Brownies learn basics like making a first aid kit and treating minor injuries, while Juniors tackle more advanced care, including serious injuries and allergic reactions. Girls will meet first responders, practice safety scenarios, and gain confidence to take action in emergencies—all while having fun!

403 Adult Leader Training and Stop the Bleed (Boise)



This two-day training event is designed to empower leaders with critical skills in emergency response and leadership development. The program is structured to provide both theoretical knowledge and practical, hands-on experience, ensuring that each participant leaves with the confidence and competence needed to lead in emergencies.

On the first evening, the focus is on the "403 Leader Training" module combined with "Stop the Bleed" techniques. The 403 Leader Training portion is designed to enhance your outdoor leadership competencies such as Fire building, Cookouts, and Camp site set up. Following this, the "Stop the Bleed" session provides practical training on identifying severe bleeding scenarios and administering immediate care. Leaders will learn how to apply direct pressure, properly use tourniquets, and execute other critical techniques that can significantly impact outcomes during traumatic emergencies.

Day two shifts the focus to medical emergency response with comprehensive sessions in CPR, First Aid, and EpiPen training. This day-long program offers detailed instruction on performing high-quality CPR, managing common injuries, and responding to severe allergic reactions with EpiPen administration. The sessions are highly interactive, featuring live demonstrations, hands-on practice with manikins and training equipment, and scenario-

based exercises to ensure skill retention. By combining these essential medical response techniques with leadership training, this event prepares each leader to effectively manage both organizational challenges and urgent medical crises in diverse settings.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Trainings Available



Would you like to get certified in Youth Mental Health First Aid?

Girl Scouts of Silver Sage offers this incredible class opportunity to any parent or volunteer working with children and adolescents. This course teaches adult participants the risk factors

and warning signs of common mental health challenges. Participants learn to support a youth developing signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in an emotional crisis by applying a core five-step action plan.

1-hour Online Pre-work must be completed before class starts. Details will be emailed after sign-up. Material cost is \$40 (troop funds can be used) Attendance is required throughout the 8-hour (9 am-5 pm) class session (includes 2 X 15 min breaks & 1 X 30 min BYO lunch) to receive a 3-year Certification.
