


Your Awesome Year as a Girl Scout Volunteer

Follow this plan to create a fun and blended experience for your multi-level troop. This will make it easy for you and your Daisies, Brownies, and Juniors to bond as a troop as you explore common themes through age-appropriate badges. Look to council or service unit events (plus generous caregivers!) to help you complete these activities. This plan is built around two meetings per month that connect content for troops serving Girl Scout Daisies, Brownies, and Juniors.

The Girl Scout Cookie Program helps troops pay for things like field trips, badges, supplies, and celebrations. Cookie sales can even help fund destinations and travel. Reach out to your council to learn more about how to participate and when your local Cookie season starts. You may need to adjust the recommended order of earning the cookie badges in your year plan.



- When you have the opportunity to get outside, take a small trip, or simply meet in a new space, do it! Shaking things up once in a while keeps things exciting.
- Check with your council to see if they're offering events or activities that your troop could attend. These events make your life easier and allow your troop to connect with other Girl Scouts from their area.

- Include time in your closing for each level to share what they worked on and what they learned. This will allow Girl Scouts to see what experiences they share as a troop and what experiences are unique to their program level.

- Find ways to unite your troop members even when the badges/awards they are working toward are different. Consider giving a fun patch or a gift to each girl so they all have something that brings them together as a troop.
