

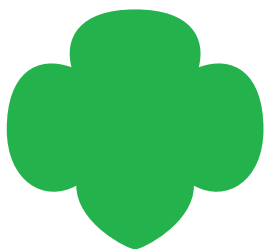

2025 Gold Award Scholarship Recipient: Savannah Clark



Savannah's Gold Award addressed the issue of lack of awareness of Middleton's food pantry. To make the pantry a more inviting space, Savannah led a volunteer force in beautifying the property. They created a

gravel walkway, weather-resistant outdoor furniture, and signs to welcome patrons. Savannah also advocated on behalf of the food pantry at a local fall festival and was able to collect multiple crates of food and financial donations. Finally, Savannah revamped the pantry's volunteer and giving network through lead generation at the pantry and community events.

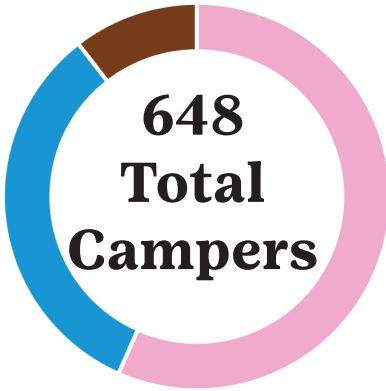

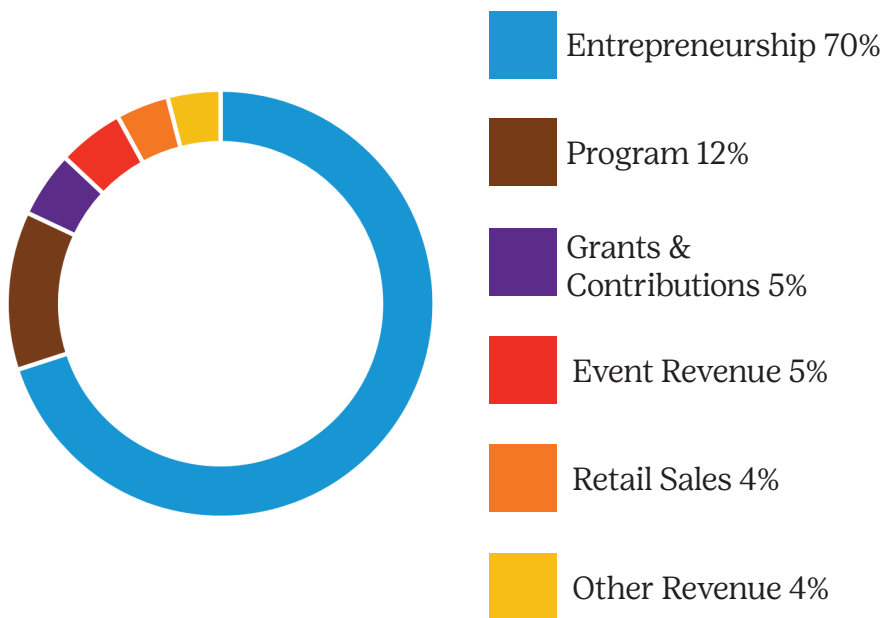

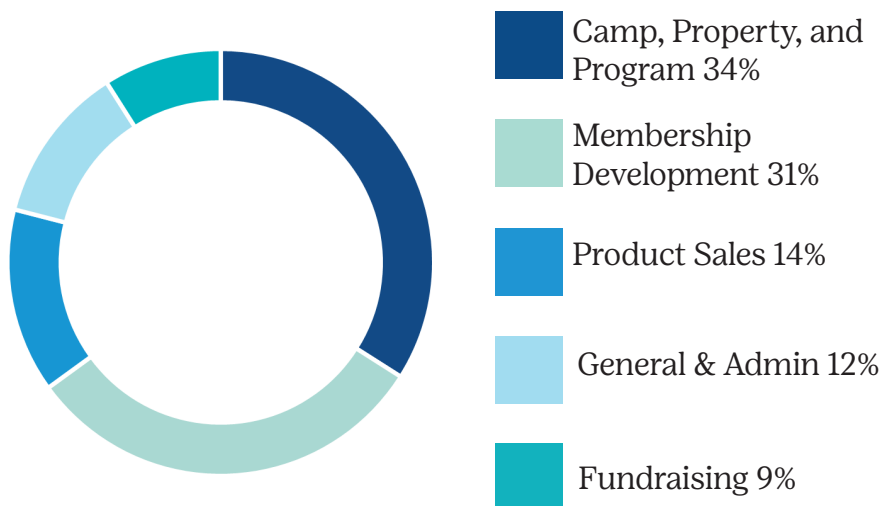


Revenue & Expenses
